## Download presentations: IT Tools REACH and Information on CLP

In collaboration with ECHA, REACH & CLP Helpdesk organized a seminar on IT tools for the REACH registration, on 5 May 2010. The presentations are now available for <u>download</u>. The REACH & CLP Helpdesk, in cooperation with chamber of crafts (Chambre des Métiers), chamber of commerce (Chambre de Commerce) and FEDIL- Business Federation Luxembourg, organised several information seminars on CLP from April to June 2010. ### New Annex II REACH on Safety datasheets (SDS)

The <u>Commission Regulation (EU) 453/2010</u> amending annex II of REACH has been published lately in the Official Journal. This update take into account the handling of SDS during the transitional period and included two versions of annex II: The first one will enter in force on 01/12/2010 (when CLP becomes obligatory for substances). The second one will enter in force on 01/06/2015 (when CLP becomes obligatory for mixtures).

### ECHA web pages on data sharing disputes

ECHA has published new web pages to provide information and assistance to companies facing difficulties in sharing data required for their registration dossiers. These web pages clarify how to approach the Agency should a dispute happen. Data sharing is one of the core principles of REACH, helping to increase the efficiency of the registration system, reduce costs and avoid unnecessary animal testing. These new pages are targeted at all registrants. They explain how data sharing should work and what to do if there is a data sharing dispute, which, of course, is a situation very much to be avoided. ## Helpdesk website: New section on CLP

## New Excel tools for CLP

ECHA published two new <u>Excel tools</u> for the C&L notification:

- C&L bulk XLM creator to generate notification files in XML format that can be submitted to the C&L inventory via the REACH-IT system
- Group creator tool to define your group of manufacturers and/or importers for C&L
  notification
