REACH Fee regulation updated

An amendment of the REACH Fee Regulation brings reduced fees for SMEs while the fee for large companies increase. The <u>Regulation (EU) 254/2013</u> changes the existing REACH Fee Regulation (EC) 340/2008. The new fees for registration and authorization apply from 22 March, i.e. already for the registration deadline of 31 May 2013. Further information can be found in the <u>ECHA News Alert</u>.

Final version of REACH review available

In February 2013, the Commission adopted the General Report "Review of REACH". The report meets a number of reporting and review obligations of the Commission five years after the date of entry into force of REACH. The final version is now available in the 22 EU languages. • Substance evaluation: First CoRAP update

The first annual update of the <u>Community rolling action plan (CoRAP)</u> for <u>2013-2015</u> is now available. It contains 115 substances of which 62 are newly allocated and 53 come from the <u>first CoRAP</u> adopted in 2012. The Member States will evaluate those substances under the substance evaluation process of the REACH Regulation in 2013, 2014, and 2015. Restrictions:

• New restriction proposal for lead and its compounds in consumer articles

A new restriction of lead and its compounds in consumer articles has been proposed. Lead is usually found in metal alloys, pigments/dyes, and to a lesser extent it is used as a stabiliser in plastic and as a pure metal. This restriction proposal addresses articles that can be placed in the mouth by small children. The <u>public consultation</u> will conclude on 21 September 2013. However, interested parties are invited to send comments by 1 June 2013 in time for the first discussion during the meetings of the Committees for Risk Assessment (RAC) and Socio-economic Analysis (SEAC). CLP (Classification, Labelling and Packaging of substances and mixtures)

New public consultations on C&L

ECHA opened public consultations on proposals for a harmonized classification and labeling for three substances. A harmonized classification and labeling is proposed for:

- Bifenazate, acaricide against a wide range of phytophagous mites and is used in crops and ornamentals; health and environmental classifications are proposed
- Triflusulfuron-methyl, a herbicide to be used in agriculture under field conditions; classifications for carcinogenicity and for hazards to the environment are proposed
- Direct Blue FC 57087, a industrial chemical used in ink and/or toners and as a dye in textiles; here it is proposed to remove the existing classification
