The REACH&CLP Helpdesk Luxembourg invites you to become familiar with the use of its "<u>REACH Excel Tool</u>". This tool is designed for companies that buy chemical products (substances and mixtures) and articles. The training will take place in the form of an interactive training session (using PC) and is aimed at those who want to become familiar with the "REACH Excel Tool". It is also a good approach to understand your obligations under REACH (level: beginners & intermediate).

These events, free of charge but registration is required, will take place from 3.30 to 5.00 pm in the premises of the Public Research Centre Henri Tudor (29, avenue John F. Kennedy) at Luxembourg-Kirchberg. This session will be held in German (similar session in French in September). The Training is jointly organised by CRP Henri Tudor and the Chambre de Métiers Luxembourg. Registration available here.

Worker protection and extended Safety data Sheet

The European Trade Union Confederation (ETUC) and the union federation IndustriAll are extending their REACH information campaign for workers. In cooperation with ECHA and the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work (EU-OSHA), the campaign promotes the understanding of REACH exposure scenarios and steps for companies to ensure the safe use of hazardous substances.

Commission publishes REACH Review and Roadmap for SVHC

Lately, the Commission published the General Report "Review of REACH" and its draft of the Roadmap for SVHCs identification and implementation of REACH Risk Management measures from now to 2020.

Besides the <u>General Report</u> itself (soon to be published in all official journal), a <u>Staff Working Document</u> gives more explanations. An overview of the main findings and the next steps can be found in the <u>Commission Press Release</u>.

In cooperation with Member States and ECHA, the Commission is developing a roadmap to assess and identify substances of very high concern (SVHC). It will set out clear milestones, deliverables and the division of work between the Commission, Member States and ECHA to place all relevant known SVHC on the candidate list by 2020. The Commission published now its <u>draft</u> that will be further discussed with the actors involved.

Registration:

• Update REACH fee regulation expected in March

Following the "REACH review", further reduction of the REACH fees for SMEs are envisaged by European Commission. Furthermore, an indexation of the fees for not-SMEs is proposed. The new regulation is supposed to enter into force before the REACH registration deadline of 31 May 2013.



New tool to improve registration dossier quality

ECHA has launched the <u>Dossier Quality Assistant</u> to help registrants to detect potential inconsistencies in their registration dossiers. Registrants are recommended to make use of the tool to proactively update dossiers or check new dossiers before submission to ECHA in order to improve the quality of REACH registrations.

New IUCLID CSR plug-in to create full chemical safety report

ECHA launched a new version of the <u>IUCLID chemical safety report (CSR) plug-in</u>. With the new release, registrants are able to integrate information directly from the Chemical safety assessment and reporting tool (Chesar) to easily create the full chemical safety report.

Warning: Is your substance no longer to be registered in 2013?

ECHA is now publishing the list to raise awareness on substances to be registered in May 2013, for which ECHA has so far neither received a lead registrant nomination nor a registration despite the fact that industry has flagged its intention to register the substance in 2013. The list currently contains around 700 substances. ECHA calls on registrants and downstream users to bring clarity on that list.

If your substance is on the list, you should contact your supplier if you are a downstream user or your SIEF members if you are a manufacturer or importer. Industry trade associations and ECHA may provide further support on deciding on the next steps. Further information can be found in the ECHA press release.

Consultation on testing proposals

Several public consultations relating to examinations of testing proposals in the framework of dossiers evaluation are currently ongoing (deadline 1, 8 and 18 March 2013). More information can be found on ECHA's website.

Substance evaluation: Tips for registrants and downstream users

ECHA published a leaflet with tips for registrants and downstream users on <u>substance evaluation</u>. It aims at companies that manufacture, import or use substances that have been included in the <u>Community Rolling Action Plan</u> (CoRAP) for substance evaluation under REACH. The leaflet provides practical advice for companies on how to participate in the substance evaluation process in five steps. The leaflet is <u>available</u> in all EU languages. 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Restriction:

New Amendment of Annex XVII REACH (restrictions)

Annex XVII REACH that defines restrictions on manufacturing, placing on the market and use of certain dangerous substances, mixtures and articles has been amended by <u>Regulation (EU) 126/2013</u>. More information can be found on <u>our website</u>.

CLP (Classification, Labelling and Packaging of substances and mixtures)

ECHA launches the Classification and Labelling Platform

The new C&L Inventory feature is a web-based discussion forum where C&L notifiers and REACH registrants of the same substance can come together and agree on the classification and labelling of their substance. The publication of the <u>C&L Platform</u> is one of the ECHA initiatives to support companies to proactively work on the quality of their notifications and better fulfill their legal obligations to come to agreed entries on the C&L Inventory, when appropriate. Registrant and notifiers are strongly encouraged to use this tool that allows them to fulfill their obligation to agree on a (self-)classification for the same substance, as foreseen in Article 41 CLP.
