Forum's new project focuses on child-resistant fastenings

Inspectors in 15 Member States (including Luxembourg) will check the safety of packaging of hazardous substances and mixtures that consumers use. The inspections will run from July to December 2015 and focus on consumer products with hazardous substances or mixtures requiring child resistant fastenings. This is the Forum's first project with a focus on enforcement of specific packaging requirements. The report will be published in June 2016. Further information can be found in ECHA's newsitem.

New RAC and SEAC conclusions

The Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC) concluded on two restriction proposals, discussed applications for authorisation and adopted harmonised classification and labelling opinions. The Committee for Socio-economic Analysis (SEAC) concluded on two restriction proposals and agreed on two draft opinions on applications for authorisation. Further information: here.

Verification of fee reductions for incorrect declaration of company size

The Management Board of ECHA has revised the levels of the administrative charge. The new scales of the charge take into account the financial gain made from an incorrect declaration of company size. ECHA's Management Board decision entered into force on 4 June 2015 following the favourable opinion of the European Commission.

REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and restrictions of CHemicals)

New version of Annex II REACH on Safety Data Sheet

Annex II REACH lays down requirements for the compilation of safety data sheets, used to provide information on chemical substances and mixtures in the European Union. Regulation (EU) 2015/830 adapts these requirements now to the fifth revision of the GHS rules for safety data sheets. Safety data sheets provided to any recipient before 1 June 2015 may continue to be used and need not comply with the Annex to the new Regulation until 31 May 2017.

Authorisation

Candidate List updated

At 15 June 2015, two substances are added to the <u>Candidate List</u> for authorisation which now contains 163 substances:

- Mixed alkyl diesters which were added to the list due to their reproductive toxicity;
- A group entry for substances with very persistent and very bioaccumulative properties. This group of substances covers particularly the karanal, mainly used as a fragrance ingredient.

As a reminder, the use of these "substances of very high concern" (SVHC) is not forbidden. They may continue to be placed on the market but are subject to communication duties by suppliers in accordance with Articles 31, 32 and 33 of REACH. Manufacturers and importers of articles that contain one of the substances must notify ECHA pursuant to Article 7.2 REACH. The deadline for notifying these two substances is 15 December 2015.

Second decision on an application to use a substance subject to authorisation published

The European Commission issued on 3 June 2015 its <u>second decision</u> to authorise an industrial use of diarsenic trioxide as a processing aid to activate the absorption and desorption of carbon dioxide by potassium carbonate from synthesis gas formed in the production of ammonia. The authorisation is valid till 21 March 2017. The authorisation holder is Yara France.

New summary table available for applications for authorisation

Companies applying for an authorisation for the use of their substances need to fill in also a summary table of their risk management measures and operational conditions. This table is now a mandatory document to be filled in and submitted as a part of the application for authorisation dossier. Further information can be found in ECHA's news alert.

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REACH fees adjusted for inflation

An amendment (Regulation (EU) 2015/864) to the Fee Regulation (EC) 340/2008, amended by Regulation (EU) 254/2013, has been published in the Official Journal of the European Union.

Are you negotiating for data for your REACH registration?

The OECD has started the publication of new data on eleven nanomaterials. ECHA encourages registrants of these substances to carefully assess the new data. Registrants encouraged to reassess information on reproductive toxicity

From 1 October 2015, ECHA will start the decision making on testing proposals on the reproductive toxicity endpoint, i.e. extended one-generation reproductive toxicity study (EOGRTS). The Agency will soon contact registrants with pending testing proposals under examination in ECHA and encourage them to update their testing proposal on reproductive toxicity to correspond with the updated REACH annexes.
