Save the date! Annual conference on 3rd December 2015

On 3rd December 2015 (12:30 to 5:15 pm), the REACH&CLP Helpdesk Luxembourg holds its annual conference at the Chamber of Commerce at Luxembourg-Kirchberg.

PBT assessments under previous legislation now available

ECHA has made the assessments conducted under previous chemicals legislation 127 substances suspected to have PBT (persistent, bioaccumulative toxic) and vPvB (very persistent and bioaccumulative) properties available. These assessments were carried out by the sub-group on identification of PBT and vPvB substances (TC NES) between 2003 and 2007.

New working group to address petroleum and coal stream substances

On 10 and 11 September, representatives from the Member States, the European Commission and stakeholder organisations met for the first time to discuss how to progress on petroleum and coal stream substances. A set of 65 substances with uses by consumers and at professional settings were given the highest priority for further work in order to focus on substances that matter the most for human health and the environment. ECHA will update the Guidance on substances in articles

Following the judgement of the Court of Justice, ECHA will update its "Guidance on requirements for substances in articles" in two stages:

- 1. A quick update in the coming months restricted to correcting the parts with references to the 0.1% limit that are no longer consistent with the conclusions of the Court judgement.
- 2. A more comprehensive exercise to allow for a general update and re-structuring of the document.

Registration

Is your employer ready for the REACH 2018 deadline?

ECHA has published a <u>leaflet</u> informing workers in chemical companies about the upcoming 2018 REACH registration deadline. Workers are encouraged to check with their employer whether the chemical substances used in the workplace are intended to be registered by 2018. Upcoming: Registration process changes in 2016

In 2016, ECHA will release new versions of the IT tools used for creating (IUCLID) and submitting (REACH-IT) registrations. The main changes will be an updated completeness check process and an improved system to make sure that all registrations for the same substance are made with a single joint registration. Evaluation – ECHA announces draft plan for substance evaluation 2016-2018

ECHA has prepared a proposal to update the <u>Community Rolling Action Plan</u> (CoRAP) for 2016-2018. The <u>draft plan</u> contains 138 substances that are proposed to be evaluated by the Member States under the substance evaluation process of REACH. It contains 53 newly selected substances and 85 substances from the <u>update</u> adopted and published on 17 March 2015 (CoRAP 2015-2017). ECHA's aim is to adopt and publish the final CoRAP update 2016-2018 by the end of March 2016. Further information can be found in ECHA's news alert.

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Restriction

Existing restriction for benzene adapted

Commission Regulation (EU) 2015/1494 adapts the existing restriction of benzene (entry 5 of Annex XVII REACH). Paragraph 3 of this entry prohibits the placing on the market or use of benzene as a substance or as a constituent of other substances, or in mixtures, in concentrations equal to or greater than 0.1 % by weight. Due to geological particularities, natural gas from certain reservoirs contains more than 0.1 % of benzene by weight but less than 0.1 % by volume. The high cost of reducing the concentration of benzene in natural gas to below 0.1 % by weight would be disproportionate and, in the light of an opinion of ECHA's Risk Assessment Committee (RAC), unnecessary for the purposes of risk management. Therefore, Annex XVII REACH is amended to allow for the placing on the market and the use of natural gas with a concentration of benzene below 0.1 % by volume.

Commission invites comments on restricting 291 substances

The European Commission has launched a <u>public consultation</u> on its proposal to restrict 291 substances that are carcinogenic, mutagenic or toxic to reproduction (CMR). The aim is to target hazardous substances in textile articles and clothing for consumers. The list of CMR substances (individual substances or groups) covered by this possible restriction would be added as a specific appendix to Annex XVII to REACH and could be regularly updated.
